

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Mother Tincture


It is the drug prepared from drug substance of vegetable and animal kingdom using strong alcohol as a vehicle, by the process of extraction in old method and by the process of maceration and percolation in the new method.

In Hahnemann's method (old method) of preparation, the drug strength of various classes of drug substances is different owing to the difference in the solubility of the drugs in various solvents. To overcome this lack of uniformity of drug strength, Homoeopathic Pharmacopoeia of United States in 1941, barring a few exceptions prescribed a uniform standard of 10% drug strength for most medicinal preparations. The tincture contains 1/10th part of medicinal substance i.e. a drug strength of 1/10, which corresponds to 1x trituration.

Sources of Drugs

1. Plant Material

About 65% of all remedies are prepared from extracts of plant materials, and because of this homeopathy is often confused with herbalism by many people. The manner of producing the two types of medicine is quite different, however. Herbal products are generally the result of an aqueous or alcoholic extraction alone, whereas in homeopathy an additional dilution process is involved. Either the whole plant may be used or only the leaves, flowers, stems or roots as specified in the



pharmacopoeia monographs. The species of plant, the parts taken, the time of collection and the extraction procedures may well differ according to the particular pharmacopoeia monograph being consulted.

The specimens are usually collected in dry, sunny weather and cleaned by careful shaking, brushing and rinsing with distilled water.



- ✓ Berries, fruits and seeds are generally gathered when ripe and must be perfect.
- ✓ Non-resinous barks are harvested from young trees late in the autumn or, depending on the species and if resinous, at the development of blossom.
- ✓ Woods are collected from young trees and shrubs before the sap rises.

A record is kept of all growing conditions and time of collection. Fresh plant material is really desirable, but for a variety of reasons dried specimens are sometimes used.



2. Animal and Insect Material

This material must be obtained from healthy specimens.

Lactrodectus is a spider whose venom is sometimes used in the treatment of angina. The bee yields Apis, a remedy used to treat peripheral oedematous conditions and the effects of stings

The insect remedies are usually quick acting, and are especially useful in inflammatory and immune responses.

3. Biological Material



- ✓ Material may be used from healthy animal or vegetable secretions or from bacterial cultures; the resulting remedy is then known as a sarcode.
- ✓ It may also be derived from diseased tissue, when the finished remedies are known as nosodes. For example, Pertussis is a sarcode produced from a culture, while Pertussin is a nosode prepared from infected sputum.
- ✓ A third variant known as a tautopathic (see below), is made from the allopathic vaccine. This differentiation is important for it has implications for the way in which these remedies are used.

SARCODES may be used according to the similimum or as a prophylactic. Examples of sarcode source material are:

- Plant Sarcodes: Terebinth, the oleic exudation from pine trees
- Animal Sarcodes: RNA and DNA; Cholesterinum, Folliculinum
- Bacterial Sarcodes: Penicillin derived from a culture

NOSODES may be used to treat pathological conditions; some historical nosodes also have drug pictures. Examples of nosode source material are:

- **Plant Nosodes**: Examples include remedies derived from Secale cornutum (ergot); Ustilago maydis (corn smut); Solanum tuberosum aegrotans (diseased potato). A drug picture of the latter, accredited to Benoit More (1809–1858), may be found in a fascinating book entitled Homoeopathy in the Irish Potato Famine (Treuherz, 1995). The isopathic use of this remedy is advocated by inoculation of healthy potatoes as a form of prophylaxis against the blight (Kennedy, 1997)
- Animal Nosodes: Derived from pathological secretions, for example: Ambra grisea (from sperm whale)
- **Microbial Nosodes:** Derived from pathological samples, for example: Syphilinum (Lueticum) spirochetes in syphilitic exudate; Variolinum from smallpox vesicle
- **Pathological Autonosodes:** Made from patients' own body fluids, exudates and infected lesions (e.g. vesicles and pustules)

4. Chemical Material

About 30% of all source material is chemical in nature. Highly purified laboratory grade material is rarely used in the preparation of remedies. The original provings carried out by Hahnemann used naturally



occurring chemicals together with their trace impurities, which are considered to contribute to the overall activity of the remedy in a symbiotic way. Thus Calc carb is obtained from the middle layers of mussel (or oyster) shells and is not prepared in the laboratory. Considering how far Hahnemann's home was from the nearest oyster beds it is perhaps surprising that he should have chosen this source when other forms of the mineral were far more accessible locally. Natrum mur is derived from sea salt and Sulphur is obtained from a naturally occurring source; neither is prepared pure in the laboratory

5. Imponderbilia

It means which is not weighable, i.e. the substance which has no perceptible weight. This is immaterial power or energy. Medicines prepared from energy available from natural and physical reactions are called imponderbilia.

They are of two types:

(i) Natural Source:

Preparation of Remedies

The following approach is not suggested, but may serve as an amusing interlude:

Take a sparrow's leg, the drumstick merely, Place in a tub, filled with water nearly, Set it out doors, in a place that's shady; Let it stand a week (three days for a lady); Drop a good spoonful in a fine large kettle Which should be of tin (or any sim'lar metal); Add one grain of salt; for thickening – one rice kernel. To light the fire – use the Homeopathic Journal. Fill the kettle up and set it a-boiling Strain the mixture well, to stop it oiling; Let the liquor stew for an hour – no longer, (For a man, of course it'll need to be stronger.) Should you now desire the soup to be 'flavoury', Stir it well, once round, with a stick of savoury. When the broth is made, nothing can excel it, So three times a day, let the patient smell it. If he chance to die, say 'T'was nature did it', If he chance to live, give the soup the credit.



Extraction

Maceration- It is a long process used for the treatment of large quantities of drug substances, needing much time for the extraction of their medicinal principles.

Substances used for maceration, include hard, gummy, mucilaginous substances and those substances having much viscid juice which prevent the rapid penetration of alcohol (menstrum) into the mass. Mother tincture cannot be obtained directly. Decantation has to be carried out before filtration.





Percolation- It is a comparatively short process, but is a special method used for the extraction of dried vegetable and drug substances. This process is carried out in a special vessel known as the percolator. Mother tincture can be obtained directly. Decantation is not necessary before filtration.

Mother tinctures are the liquid preparations resulting from the extraction of suitable source material with alcohol/water mixtures which form the starting point for the production of most homeopathic medicines. Comminution followed by standard percolation, maceration and squeezing techniques are used on fresh plants (which yield around 350 ml of juice per kg) and succulents (which yield up to twice the plant harvest), while dried specimens are subjected mainly to percolation with alcohol on a column.

The resulting solutions are strained and can contain one part drug to three parts mother tincture, although this strength can vary from 10 to 50% depending on the species and monograph being used. When the final tincture represents one-tenth of the concentration of original drug it is, in effect, a 1x dilution.

In later life, around 1835, Hahnemann is reported to have stopped using the mother tincture method of preparing potencies for soluble source material, preferring to process crude plant drugs, expressed juices and fresh plants by trituration with lactose. Trituration is the grinding of powders in a mortar with a pestle. It is the primary mode of mixing used for the preparation of powdered dilutions in homeopathy. Initially this trituration process was taken to the 12c level, but subsequently he changed to the 3c, producing higher potencies in fluid form. Compared with medicines produced from mother tinctures and solutions, this offered advantages in more powerful action, longer shelf-life and retained constituents. Hahnemann processed a total of 54 mineral and plant remedies in this way. Although it would appear to be beneficial, the method is not generally used by modern producers other than for insoluble material.

Description of Some Important Mother Tinctures:

1. Abies Nigra

Natural Order: Coniferae

Common Name: Black Spruce

Habitat: America

- **Clinical**⁹: Constipation, Cough, Dyspepsia, Eructations, Haemorrhages, hypochondriasis, malarial fevers, Tea effects of, Tobacco effects of.
- This agent acts upon the mucous membrane of the stomach, causing a derangement of the digestive process.¹⁷
 - In dyspeptic troubles of the aged, with functional heart symptoms; also after tea or tobacco.⁸
- The tincture relieved the usual severe pain in the stomach after eating, the acid eructations, and the frequent vomiting of food.⁷
- Where this symptom is present, whether in dyspepsia, lung disease (when the sensation is as if there was a hard substance to be coughed up) with or without haemoptysis, constipation, and Ab. n. will be the most likely remedy.⁹
- Dyspnoea; worse lying down; sharp, cutting pain in heart; heart's action heavy and slow; tachycardia, bradycardia.⁸
- Chronic intermittent fever, accompanied by this peculiar distressing pain above the stomach.10
- Pain in external meatus.⁸
- Uterine displacement.¹¹
- DOSAGE: Mother tincture and 3x ¹⁷

2. Balsamum Tolutanum

Common Name: Balsam of myroxylon tolniferum.

Natural Order: Leguminosæ.

Habitat: Central America.

Properties: Stimulant, expectorant.

- Chronic bronchitis with profuse expectoration.²³
- Has a tonic influence upon the mucous membrane. It appears to stimulate to normal action and is therefore of value in dry, hacking cough, as well as where there is great excess in expectoration the result of relaxed condition of the mucous membrane.²⁹
- Historical dose: Tincture and all potencies.²³







3. Fragaria Vesca

Natural Order: Rosaceae.

Common Name: Wood strawberry.

Habitat: United States.

- CLINICAL⁹- Anasarca, Biliousness, Chilblains, Convulsions, Erysipelas, Gonorrhoea, Psilosis (or Sprue), Tapeworm, Tongue- strawberry swollen, Urticaria, Weaning.
- This agent when used freely prevents the formation of calculi, and removes the tartar from the teeth, and prevents attacks of gout.¹⁷
- It also cures gouty pains and prevents the formation of stone in abdomen, and sprue in hot climate.²⁴
- It is of service in urticarious, petechial and erysipelatous eruptions.¹⁷
- Lack of mammary secretion.⁸
- Chilblains; worse during hot weather.⁸
- It is commended by W. Salmon as a wash for sore-mouth; as a haemostatic arresting the menses and stopping "bloody-flux;" swelling of the spleen; many forms of skin eruption and for "clearing the complexion."⁹
- Historical dose: Tincture and all potencies.²³

4. Cistus Canadensis

Natural Order: Cistaceae.

Common Name: Frostwort.

Habitat: United States.

- This agent produces catarrh of the mucous membranes and induration of the glandular system.¹⁷
- A deep-acting anti-psoric remedy, with marked action in glandular affections, herpetic eruptions, chronic swellings, when patient is extremely sensitive to cold. Sensation of coldness in various parts.⁸
- Malignant disease of the glands of the neck.⁸
- Chronic Laryngitis (Dry throat, as if there was sand in it)²⁵
- Chronic sinusitis.²⁷
- Cistus has affinity for naso-pharynx; aborts colds that center in posterior nose.⁸
- Poisoned wounds, bites, phagedenic ulcers.⁸As a local wash, it is said to arrest foetid discharges from the ear, throat and other passages of the body.²⁶
- Scrofulous ophthalmia.⁸
- Pyorrhoea. [Merc. cor.; Caust.; Staph.; Kreos.] Hurts to protrude the tongue.⁸
- Asthmatic after lying down (trachea feels narrow), preceded by formication.⁸







- Goitre with frequent diarrhoea.²⁷
- Chronic dysentery¹⁵
- This remedy acts especially in cancer of the breast, pharynx or neck and gives rise to very marked cervical adenopathy.²⁸
- Prescribed dose: First to thirtieth attenuation. Locally as a wash to arrest fetid discharges.²¹

5. Ulmus Campestris/ Ulmus Fulva

Natural Order: Ulmaceae of the Urticaceae.

Common Name: American Slippery Elm.

- A decoction of the viscous inner bark of Ul. ful. is much used as a poultice for lessening pain in inflammations.⁹
- Formication in feet, numb, creeping pain in legs and feet; rheumatic pains above wrists; numbness, tingling, and full soreness where gastrocnemius gives off its tendon.²¹
- The bark in trituration gives much relief as a snuff in old vascular deafness with tubal obstruction (Cooper).⁹
- In a case in which the mucous membrane of the rectum was dry and extremely painful, Burnett relieved the sufferings with 20- drop doses of the tincture.⁹



• Constipation. Deafness. Hemorrhoids. Herpes. Pain. Sore throats. Syphilis.²³

6. Glycerinum

Proper Name: Propenyl Alcohol.

Synonyms: Glycerina. Glycerin.

Common Name: Glycerine.

Formula: C3 H8 O3.

- Glycerine has proved itself to be a tissue builder and is of undoubted value in marasmus.16 it disturbs nutrition in its primary action, and, secondarily, seems to improve the general state of nutrition. (Dr. Wm.B. Griggs).⁸
- It has proved of undoubted value in diabetes influenzalpneumonia, neurasthenia, many forms of gastroenteric


diseases, various types of senile debility, acute catarrhal conditions of the mucous membrane of the naso-pharynx and nephritis in the aged.¹⁶

- Diabetes. Pernicious anemia.²³
- Historical dose: Tincture and all potencies, thirtieth and higher potencies.²³

8. Castanea Vesca

Natural Order: Cupuliferae.

Common Name: chestnut, American Chestnut.



Habitat: North America.

- A useful remedy in whooping-cough, especially in the early stage, with dry, ringing, violent, spasmodic cough.²¹
- Desire for warm drinks. Very thirsty.²¹
- Thick urine.²¹
- Prescribed dose: Tincture.²¹

9. Fraxinus Americana

Natural order: Oleaceae.

Common name: White Ash.

- This remedy is indicated in enlargement and subinvolution of the the uterus, when attended with prolapsus and a bearing down sensation.¹⁷
- It is an organ-remedy of the first rank.9
- Said to be the medicinal pessary of the first order.²¹
- DOSAGE: Of the tincture, 1 to 60 drops.¹⁷

10. Filix Mas

Natural Order: Filices.

Common Name: Male Fern.

- The great use of this remedy has been in the removal of tape worms.¹⁷
- Teste has used it successfully in a case of violent dyspnoea without cough, with stitches in region of heart and obscure symptoms of pericarditis.⁹
- Torpid inflammations of lymphatic glands.⁸
- Dr Hering recommends use of this remedy along with Kousso, in mother tinctures, against tape worms. He recommends that the patient should fast on the day before using the medicine and take a dose of castor oil 2 hours after using any of these remedies.³⁰

11. Galium Aparine

Natural Order: Rubiaceae.

Common Name: Cleavers.

- This remedy is indicated in dysuria, cystitis with much burning upon urinating.¹⁷
- Has power of suspending or modifying cancerous action. Has clinical confirmation of its use in cancerous ulcers and nodulated tumors of the tongue.⁸











- Favors healthy granulations on ulcerated surfaces.8
- DOSAGE: Of the tincture, 1 to 60 drops.¹⁷

12. Geranium Maculatum

Natural Order: Geraniaceae.

Common Name: wild cranebill.

- It is indicated in passive hemorrhages from different parts of the body.17
- It may be a haemoptysis, accompanying pulmonary tuberculosis, when it not only assists in controlling the haemoptysis, but it improves the general tone of the body and benefits the night sweats.¹⁷
- Ulceration of stomach. Atonic and foul ulcers. Lessens the vomiting in gastric ulcer.8



DOSAGE:⁸ - Tincture, half-dram doses in gastric ulcer. Tincture, to third attenuation, as a general rule. - Locally, in ulcers, it will destroy the pyogenic membrane.


